- Technology is not a silver bullet that will make kids magically engaged.
- If you don't have purpose behind the the technology and purpose driven professional development then it is a lost opportunity.
- Start with “what is your learning goal”?
- Creating a dynamic learning experience.
 - The Dynamic Learning Framework
 - Student learning is at the center.
 - **A lesson does not have to include technology to be dynamic.**
 - Beyond the bell
 - Learning doesn't have to stop when the bell rings.
 - Beyond the grade level and subject area
 - Pushing beyond the curriculum
 - Beyond the walls
 - Bring the outside world into your classroom
 - Beyond the tools
 - Use tools in alternative and new ways.
 - Beyond the due date
 - Coaching students to keep the learning going even after the learning has been assessed.
 - Begin with way to go beyond.

- Example of going beyond the tool
 - Try alternative ways to use Google Slides
- Utilizing GSuite tools to create a dynamic learning experience.
 - Why use Gsuite?
 - It's a very reliable platform
 - Offers the best collaborations tools out there
 - Unlimited storage
 - Easy to figure out and use
 - Don't fall into the trap of using the tools in the same way over and over again.
 - Diversify the way you use the tools and which tools you use to keep the engagement and learning going.
 - Use the same tool but find different ways to use it.
 - Example use [Google Slides](#) like Instagram.
 - Create an ebook using Google Slides.
 - **Change the size of the page to create your slides 8.5" x 11"**
 - Download as PDF to make it easy for others to open.
 - Put the creation into the student's hands.
- What does dynamic learning look like in the classroom?
 - Using Google Slides for students to create their own learning goals.
 - Student created vision boards.
 - Students visualize themselves accomplishing a goal and revisit this as you work toward meeting that goal.
 - Great back to school activity.
 - [Google groups](#) can be used to create a discussion board for students.
- Other tools for graphic design
 - Adobe Spark Post
 - Canva
 - Whatever your tool of choice is find a different spin and a different way to use it.
- If the assignment can be easily duplicated by another student then we need to rethink what we are doing.
 - Create opportunities for reflection.
 - Build in choice for your students.
 - Give students choice of what tools they can use to complete the task.
 - Offer three to five tools and link to the tools.
 - Choice of devices like phones, computer or tablet.
 - Choice of using any tool they want.
 - Interactive learning menus or choice boards
 - Give students multiple ways to reach the learning goal.
 - A list or creative way of giving students options of ways to accomplish the learning goal.
 - Tic-tac-toe boards.

- Make one a non-negotiable or make sure they do one of each color.
- Learning menu on Slides
- BINGO boards
